# 2009 Country Program Interim Evaluation (CPiE) of EU Pre-accession Assistance to Croatia

## JMC and IPA TAIB SMC Meeting Zagreb, 15 December 2009

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#### **OBJECTIVE AND NATURE**

- Focus at the **program level** (instead of sector level as done in past Interim Evaluations)
- **▶** Emphasis on **operational aspects**, to identify practical recommendations
- → Coverage: initially focus on PHARE 05 & 06 and IPA 07, but IPA 08 & 09 also taken into account to the extent feasible
- → Combination of desk work and field work (over **40** interviews)
- → Also capacity building activities (January 2010)



#### **KEY FINDINGS**

- → List of project proposals still **too long** and the logic for prioritization remains unclear
- → Improvement in the quality of Project Fiches, especially for IPA 08
- → Signs of improvement in **procurement** (duration of tendering procedures)
- → Progress in **monitoring reports**, but room for improvement
- → Project objectives generally **well aligned with priorities** but difficult to measure performance due to **poor indicators**
- **→** <u>Prospects</u> for impact and sustainability seriously affected by **problems with personnel, namely staff retention**



### AN EXAMPLE: USE OF INDICATORS IN PROJECT FICHES

- → There are still problems in the selection of indicators (about 1/3 are 'misplaced')
- ▶ But the overall quality is clearly improving, with higher degree of SMARTness

#### **KEY RECOMMENDATIONS**

- **→** Strengthen the screening of project proposals
- **▶** Ensure continued cooperation between CODEF and CFCA to **enhance 'implementability'**
- → Rebalance the **areas of responsibility of SMSC**, to enhance alignment with IPA priorities and better apportion the workload
- → Improve the **structure of monitoring reports**, to make them more informative

#### and most importantly

→ Address the issue of personnel, the single most important factor impacting on the quality of assistance, and potentially with far reaching consequences (e.g. access to structural funds)
